LAST WEEK'S TRIVIA ANSWER: During the midnight Mass of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 1891, at the Marian Shrine of Finca Betania in Cua, Venezuela, Father Otty Ossa Aristizabel, the Chaplain of the Shrine, noticed that a



red substance had begun to emanate from one of the pieces of the Host that he had divided. At 6 am the next morning, he observed that blood continued to flow from the Host (which he kept in the

sacristy overnight) and later on that the blood had begun to dry. The blood was later determined to be AB positive, like that found in the cloth of the Shroud of Turin and also in the Host of the Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano. In 1998, a pilgrim who had come to see the miraculous Host of Betania briefly witnessed - and videotaped - the Host appearing as if in flames with a pulsating heart bleeding in its center.

**NEW TRIVIA QUESTION:** Our Lady of Life Shrine, which features a stunning, emotion-filled depiction of Mother Mary cradling the infant Jesus, is visited by parishioners and visitors alike. But perhaps there is one thing you might not know or even notice as you step up the brick path and greet her with flowers, candles, and prayers. Take a good look at the stonework that surrounds her. Our question today is simply this: Where did those stones come from?
